Section 32 Resignation in the Face of Discipline

On December 6, 2016, a Resignation Committee of the Law Society of Alberta accepted an application by K. June Koska, a member of the Law Society, who lives and practiced law in St. Albert, Alberta, to resign pursuant to section 32 of the *Legal Profession Act* R.S.A. 2000, c. L-8. Ms. Koska's resignation is effective December 17, 2016.

At the time of her resignation, Ms. Koska was facing citations alleging conduct deserving of sanction. Ms. Koska denied the merit of a former client's complaint alleging that Ms. Koska failed to respond in a timely manner to her client, opposing counsel and a third party; failed to move the client's matter forward; failed to provide Statements of Account and failed to inform her client that she was suspended on March 31, 2014. Ms. Koska admitted that she failed to respond to communications from the Law Society during the period of March 2015 until July 2016.

The full written decision of the Resignation Committee will be posted to the Law Society of Alberta website when it is issued.
