### **Disbarment**

On September 8, 2008, a Resignation Committee appointed by the Benchers of the Law Society of Alberta granted the application of **Charles F. McGee** to resign, pursuant to Section 61 of the *Legal Profession Act*, effective immediately. Mr. McGee is therefore disbarred.

Mr. McGee resides in Yellowknife, Northwest Territories and practised in Yellowknife until 2004. He was suspended pursuant to Section 83(7) of the *Legal Profession Act*, effective October 22, 2004. Mr. McGee's application to resign was made at a time when he faced proceedings under Part 3 of the *Legal Profession Act*, arising from his conviction and sentence to a term of imprisonment for criminal offences committed in the Northwest Territories.

The Committee directed that Mr. McGee pay the actual costs of the proceedings, estimated to be the sum of \$2,289.00, prior to any application for reinstatement.

As Mr. McGee had no practice in Alberta, a custodian was not required.
