Suspension

On December 19, 2019, a Hearing Committee of the Law Society of Alberta found the conduct of Wei Wu, a member of the Law Society who lived and practiced in Calgary, Alberta to be deserving of sanction pursuant to Section 72(1)(b) of the *Legal Profession Act* R.S.A. 2000, c. L-8. The Hearing Committee ordered that Wei Wu be suspended for four months, commencing December 19, 2019.

Mr. Wu was found guilty of five citations: threatening or advising his client to proceed with criminal charges against the complainant to gain a benefit for the client; failing to perform legal services to the standard of a competent lawyer; failing to be candid with the Law Society of Alberta; communicating with a former client directly without the consent of the client's lawyer; and attempting to deter a former client from proceeding with a claim to his insurer.

The Hearing Committee also awarded costs of \$9,126.79 to the Law Society.

The full written decision of the Hearing Committee will be posted to the Law Society of Alberta website when it is issued.
